What is a noun?

The definition of a **noun** is a **person**, **place**, **thing**, or **idea**. The word "idea" refers to a quality or a state of being. Essentially, if something can be named, it is a noun.

Person	Place	Thing	ldea
teacher	garage	paw	democracy
uncle	city	giraffe	fame
niece	park	ice cream	love
John	Paris	doorknob	disappointment

Nouns are also singular or plural in form, and both singular and plural nouns may be possessive. The "job" of a noun is as the object or the subject of a sentence, clause, or phrase.

For right now, though, we will only be considering what a noun is and what kinds of nouns there are.

In the following excerpt the nouns have been marked. Notice how each of these words "names" something.
